The regular meeting of the Retirement Board of the Policemen's Annuity and Benefit Fund was held March 22, 2018, at 12:30 P.M. at the office of the Fund, 221 N. LaSalle Street, Room 1626, Chicago, Illinois for the consideration of applications and bills, and for other such matters that came before the Board. The Fund's documentation indicates an inaccurate date of birth was consistently used on documents of Retired Officer Jordan. The birth date used of 1928 differs from the actual birth date of 1932. This inaccurate date accelerated cost-of-living adjustments paid to him. The summation of these cost-of-living increases paid based upon an inaccurate date of birth sums to over \$72,000.

The Board requested the Executive Director contact the widow to make an effort to recover the overpayment, with a reasonable payment plan.

32 OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE DISABILITY CLAIM

Storey, Ricardo T. ♥

Ricardo Storey appeared before the Board, without counsel, on his claim for an occupational disease disability benefit. Board counsel reviewed with Ricardo Storey the procedures of an administrative hearing, along with his right to have an attorney represent him. Mr. Storey agreed to proceed without legal representation. After hearing testimony from Officer Ricardo, the Board's consulting physician, Dr. Peter Orris, and reviewing the records submitted in this matter, *it was moved by Trustee Wright, seconded by Trustee Wodnicki that the Board award Officer Ricardo T. Storey an occupational disease disability benefit.*

- The next item discussed concerned the option for retirees to authorize deductions from their pensions for healthcare coverage provided by Aetna; Blue Cross/Blue Shield; and United American Insurance, as previously discussed and approved by the Board. To establish this deduction from a member's annuity, Fund staff had sent written communication to annuitants in which each annuitant was to provide written authorization for the insurance premium deduction. The insurance companies have sent files of enrolled members with the deductions charged, which have been paid to ensure continuation of coverage for the annuitants. To date, however, there are slightly less than 200 members that have deductions coming out of their pension checks, but such members have yet to provide written authorization. A drafted letter was distributed to the Board members' review. This letter will be sent to the members requesting completion of the authorization. Ms. Tuczak noted this is a sensitive matter as the Fund does not wish to stop the deductions and cause a lapse in health care coverage.
- Ms. Tuczak next revisited the annuity overpayment to Chester Hornowski, which was discussed at a previous meeting. Ms. Tuczak had spoken again with Mr. Hornowski's surviving spouse, who again offered to forfeit the death benefit of \$6,000 in lieu of any further recovery. However, if an additional money sum is to be requested of her, Ms. Hornowski requested the death benefit be paid to her and she will agree to a \$50 monthly payment towards the indebtedness.

It was moved by Trustee Wright, seconded by Trustee Summers that the Board accept the \$6,000 death benefit that the surviving spouse of Mr. Hornowski offered in lieu of the \$15,000 overpayment.

- While on the topic of annuity overpayments, Ms. Tuczak discussed the matter of deceased widow, Ellen Collins. During the Fund's signature affidavits request, Ellen Collins had failed to return her affidavit. This resulted in a suspension of her widow's annuity late in 2016. During the Fund's investigation it was revealed that Ellen Collins passed away in 2014, resulting in an overpayment of widow's annuity of approximately \$14,000. Attempts to recover the erroneously paid annuity have gone unresolved. After much discussion it was agreed that Board counsel shall contact the family members of Ellen Collins and work on a resolution, which may include reporting the matter to the State's Attorney or criminal charges.

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- The next item was an update concerning the Lieutenants' grievance settlement regarding pensionable salary increases effective July 1, 2016. After discussion on this matter, the Board agreed that retroactive pension calculations would only be completed after finalization of the new salary contract between the respective union and the City of Chicago. This procedure will ensure that retroactive calculations are completed only once on each member impacted.
- The next item for discussion was two legislative matters. There are two bills pending downstate; one is a compound COLA after age of 75; and the other is removing the birth year restriction on the 3.0% COLA. The Board requested impact statements on both legislative matters, but also requested the Executive Director to negotiate price concessions with the Fund's actuarial firm, GRS. The Executive Director discussed the pricing obtained and expected timeline of the impact statements.
- While on the topic of actuarial issues there was discussion concerning the December 31, 2017, valuation. For the December 31, 2016, valuation, the liability associated with the healthcare subsidy was removed because at that time no subsidy was provided through the statutes. However, an Appellate court decision has changed things. At issue, however, is that the mechanics of this subsidy issued through the Appellate court have not been determined and are still being negotiated with the various parties involved. In order to complete the actuarial valuation in-time for year-end reporting requirements, a decision on inclusion of the liability must be determined very soon. After discussion it was mutually agreed to not include the insurance subsidy in the 2017 valuation, due to uncertainty of the exact members and dollars involved.
- Ms. Tuczak next discussed a request from the Fraternal Order of Police's (FOP) Disability Committee, who wishes to perform a mailing to current members in receipt of disability benefits, but does not have addresses on these members. The practice of the Fund is that member addresses are not provided to outside parties, however, a blind mailer can be sent. The procedure is such that the Fund provides addresses to a printer selected by the Fund, the FOP provides their printing material to the printer, and the printer sends the materials, at the expense of the FOP. Once the mailing is complete, the printer destroys this address list, never giving the addresses to the FOP. The Board approved providing the addresses in this manner for the FOP requested mailing.
- The last item concerns a disability recipient, Patricia J. Mackey. She was scheduled twice to be examined by the Board's physician, and failed to keep the appointments. She is scheduled for a third time to see the Board's physician. The policy has been if a member fails to keep medical appointments, the disability benefit shall be suspended until the appointment is kept.

It was moved by Trustee Hamburger, seconded by Trustee Wodnicki that the Board suspend Patricia Mackey's disability benefit until she attends her scheduled medical appointment.
