

Saul Del Rivero is a business and labor-focused professional whose career spans law enforcement, union advocacy, and private-sector leadership. A former Chicago Police Detective, he served in Area One, Fugitive Apprehension Section, and the Cold Case Homicide Squad, contributing to multiple high-profile investigative successes. Saul also served in the 013th and 025th Districts as a Patrol Officer.

In 2011, Saul was appointed Field Representative for the Chicago Fraternal Order of Police, where he represented more than 17,000 active and retired officers. In this role, he managed labor grievances, pension and medical matters, legislative outreach, and media relations. He also modernized member communications by launching the Department's first smartphone application and coordinated a large-scale rally in Springfield to advocate for pension protections. Among his most notable achievements was helping bring attention to and support the passage of **Public Act 97-1167 (2013)**, landmark legislation that allows officers to receive inpatient treatment for mental health issues without automatic revocation of their FOID card or loss of employment.

Saul also brings substantial private-sector leadership experience. As Managing Partner and Vice President of a Houston-based enterprise, he drove revenue growth, scaled operations, strengthened financial controls, and secured national brand partnerships, more than doubling leasing revenue and significantly expanding the company's market reach.

He currently serves as Partner and Chief Operating Officer of an Illinois-based firm providing services to major trade unions and building contractors throughout the Midwest.
